Kia ora e te whānau,

You'll see there is a bit going on around our kura at the moment which is creating a real buzz for everyone. This week exterior paintwork has started on an entire repaint of the school over the next few weeks. Already, it has made a striking difference to the hall with the painting crew working at speed along the Dyer Street Side of our kura. Once school finishes, they will move internally into the school grounds to complete the job.

The cricket net is also coming along nicely with the concrete slab down and artificial turf in place. Ngā mihi to Tidy Slabs and Palmer and Cook for their support of this project so far. Our next step is to dig out the remainder of the run-up area, put in the base course and turf, and then get a net around the perimeter. This should be all done by the time we return to school next year.

We aim to confirm the new logo shortly, and then offer whānau the chance to buy sports tops for 2024. We are currently getting samples made and will have some for you to try on for your tamariki before Christmas. Orders will be made online via a Google form. We will expect these tops to arrive by mid-February. You can see a sample of the sports tops to the right.

From next week onwards, we will be trying a new system for children who arrive late to school. If your child is late, they must come to the office and sign in themselves on the Vistab System (pad) Personally I have seen this system work well and it is accommodating to all ages once they know the process. One of the main reasons for this is our manual system of checking students as they arrive becomes difficult if the office are busy and we miss children as they come in. I will be sending a video out to the tamariki explaining the process on Monday.

We are now looking ahead to 2024 with great excitement. We have finalised class placements, teachers and class spaces. If you intend on leaving, please let us know so we can make any adjustments to any class lists, and on the flipside, if you are enrolling your tamariki or know of someone who is interested, please use the online enrolment form or grab a pack from the office.

Room four have shown great persistence and joy learning this new


